At the outset, Chairman Senate welcomed the members present in the meeting. The Chairman Senate introduced the new members to the Senate viz. Prof. Abhay Gandhi, Professor, Dept. of Electronic Engr. VNIT Nagpur, Prof. Vikram M. Gadre, Professor, Dept. of Electrical Engr. IIT Bombay; Sh. Prakash Kajave, Principal Specialist, Training & Capability Development Tech Mahindra, Pune;Dr. P.S. Sathidevi, Professor (HAG), ECE Dept., Former Deputy Director & Director in Charge, NIT Calicut; Dr. Upendra Kumar Singh, Distinguished Scientist and Director General Life Sciences, DRDO, Government of India; Sh. Niranjan A. Pol, Sr. Engineering Director, Seagate Research Group, Seagate Technology HDD(India) Pvt Ltd,. The Senate greeted the new members.

The Chairman Senate then had a word of appreciation for those faculty colleagues who have received the confirmation on sanction of major research projects, with substantial grants, under various schemes. Chairman Senate further informed the Senate that about 22 Ph.Ds have been awarded this academic year till now. The Senate applauded and congratulated the colleagues. The Chairman Senate also informed the members that IIIT Allahabad is ranked at 1401+ position in QS World University Ranking 2025, amongst top Global Universities.

The Chairman Senate also briefed about 28th Special Senate which was NEP Ordinance related and 27th Senate which was Convocation specific and informed the senate members there were many internal meetings held after the last senate meeting related to the articulation of Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for NEP Ordinances, academic activities, Course Syllabi, PhD external mode seats, and so on, which actually, in general, were considered as a follow up of earlier senate meetings and/or preparations for the prospective Senate meetings. It is pertinent to mention that four senate meetings have been already conducted in the academic year 2023-24 (July-23 to June-24), considering the needs of addressing the prevailing academic issues of the Institute, and two of these have been conducted in year-2024. Even so, a sufficient number of Senate meetings, need to be organized and will be organized in a calendar year (minimum four), as per statutory provisions in this regard, with the tentative schedule appearing in the Academic calendar.

The Senate discussed each syllabus and observed that except BTech IT, BTech IT (BIn), MTech IT & MTech ECE syllabus, the syllabi for BTech ECE, MTech AS and MBA deptt (III and IV semester) need further refinement to make it more standardized.

It was resolved that a committee will be formed by the Chairman Senate for preparation, refinement, fine tuning of syllabi for BTech ECE, MTech AS and MBA Dept. (III and IV semester). The Senate authorized the Chairman Senate to approve the syllabi.

The senate also resolved that the direct admission to M.Tech Program against vacant seats may be taken up in "Pilot Mode" for 2 years for filling vacant M.Tech seats from 2024 batch onwards.

The members and Chairman-Senate agreed to the suggestion, towards its prospective implementation from the next iteration. Two members, namely, Prof. Purohit and Prof. Ranjit Singh expressed their reservations against one of the nominees, Prof. Vyas, which were noted by the Chairman-Senate. While responding to the concerns of the members, the Chairman mentioned that he would ensure the observance of integrity and inclusivity on part of the nominees, while deciding their stand in the BoG meetings, in particular, on the welfare related issues of faculty/staff.
